



Muslim-Christian Initiative  
On the Nuclear Weapons Danger



Dear Friend:

In May of 2005, Muslim and Christian scholars and leaders gathered to discuss what their religious traditions could offer to address the issue of nuclear arms danger. The meeting was convened through the combined efforts of the Islamic Society of North America (ISNA), the Managing the Atom Project of the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University, the Rockefeller Brothers Fund, and the Churches' Center for Theology and Public Policy (CCTPP).

This historic meeting produced the "Statement Regarding Muslim-Christian Perspectives on the Nuclear Weapons Danger." and led ISNA and CCTPP to create the Muslim-Christian Initiative as an ongoing advocacy program.

Two years later, the Muslim-Christian Initiative is working to engage more fully with Muslim and Christian grassroots groups: churches, Islamic centers and interfaith coalitions. At this juncture, we would like to offer you the opportunity to **get active in this initiative by becoming trained to conduct sessions** using the study guide in your community.

**Training for facilitators in DC, MD and VA will be held at the Wesley Theological Seminary on December 1, 2007.** The full day training will cover the study guide, best practices for facilitation and discussion on implementation in your community. Lunch will also be provided. **Applications must be received by November 28, 2007** and the training size is limited.
